### Dear community, partners and friends!

The year 2025 was another year of living under constant threats and challenges for Kyiv's municipal infrastructure. Despite devastating enemy attacks, the coldest winter in many years, and power supply disruptions, we managed to maintain control of the city and ensure the stable functioning of its key sectors.

Throughout the year, the enemy carried out missile and drone attacks targeting critical energy, heating, and water supply infrastructure. Despite these challenges, schools, kindergartens, hospitals, and public transport continued to operate across the capital. Municipal and emergency services worked around the clock to restore heating, electricity, and water to Kyiv residents.

Security remained the top priority for the city authorities in 2025. We consistently restored and modernised life-support systems to increase their resilience against threats.

In 2025, the city allocated almost UAH 12 billion to the needs of the Security and Defence Forces, which is twice as much as in 2024. Kyiv also developed its training system for national resistance. Throughout the year, nearly 67 thousand Kyiv residents completed this training.

To further strengthen the city's power grid, the municipal authorities worked on developing local energy sources, implementing solutions for critical infrastructure, and increasing the energy independence of hospitals and the transport system, as well as integrating renewable energy sources and energy storage systems.

The capital continued to support residents in need. In 2025, over UAH 11.4 billion was allocated from the city budget for social support. Out of this, UAH 7.4 billion went towards assistance for orphans, low-income families, combat veterans, family members of those killed in action, missing or held captive, and internally displaced persons.

Since 2014, Kyiv has provided shelter to over 436 thousand

Ukrainians forced to flee their homes due to the war, including nearly 240 thousand people displaced since the start of the full-scale invasion. As part of comprehensive support measures, internally displaced persons received financial assistance amounting to UAH 459 million. This support included targeted payments, child meal allowances, travel compensation, rehabilitation services, and other essential benefits.

Veteran policy remained a distinct priority, with efforts focused on integration, social protection, rehabilitation, and economic self-realization.

Ukraine's Defenders (both men and women) received financial, socio-psychological and rehabilitation assistance. In the capital's healthcare facilities, veterans underwent treatment and recovery following injuries, incorporating advanced approaches in cardiac surgery, endoprosthetics, neurosurgery and ophthalmology. Female veterans were provided with comprehensive healthcare check-ups free of charge. A stem cell and skin regeneration laboratory, a modern prosthetics centre, and 9 mental health centres were operational.

To accelerate socialisation and support veterans in returning to economic activity, a dedicated job board was launched on the Portal of Ukraine's Defenders. Career consulting, vocational guidance and civilian employment assistance were provided on an ongoing basis. Additionally, the city introduced micro-grants to help veterans launch or expand their own businesses.

Kyiv continued its work on shaping a barrier-free and inclusive urban environment. The capital updated its public transport, created accessible routes across the city's districts, and expanded accessibility within culture and education. The city also implemented electronic services and digitised its public operations. In 2025, Kyiv ranked first in the Transparent Cities rating for its progress in developing digital services.

Kyiv received vital support from its partner cities. To reinforce the capital's energy resilience, the city was provided with generators, mobile boiler houses and other critical equipment. With the support of the Berlin Mayor's Office and the charity organisation Life Bridge Ukraine GmbH, the high-tech prosthetics centre 'Human Titans' was opened and fully equipped in the capital.

The French Government provided the capital's healthcare facilities with modern diagnostic and mechanical cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) equipment. The Brussels Mayor's Office also continued to assist in equipping several of Kyiv's medical institutions. In 2025, Poland, Germany, Sweden, Finland, France and Morocco hosted 190 children from vulnerable categories for health and rehabilitation stays.

In conclusion, Kyiv in 2025 continued to develop a security-focused urban model while advancing measures to strengthen energy resilience, inclusivity, and innovation. The city also carried on with the reconstruction of housing and municipal infrastructure damaged by enemy shelling, and prioritised the renewal of roads and overpasses in the greatest need of repair.

My sincere gratitude goes to everyone who worked for the capital, defended it, and ensured the continuity of the city's vital operations - and to all who continue this work today.

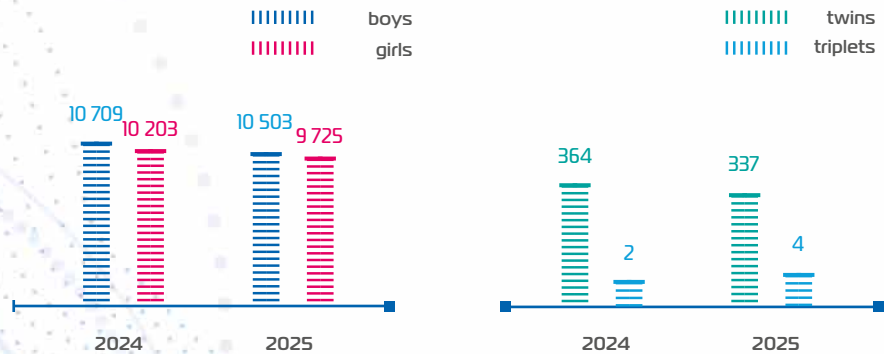

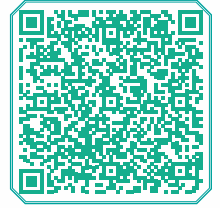

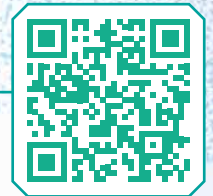
## TERRITORIAL DEFENCE (TD)

### READINESS TO RESPOND IMMEDIATELY TO MILITARY THREATS

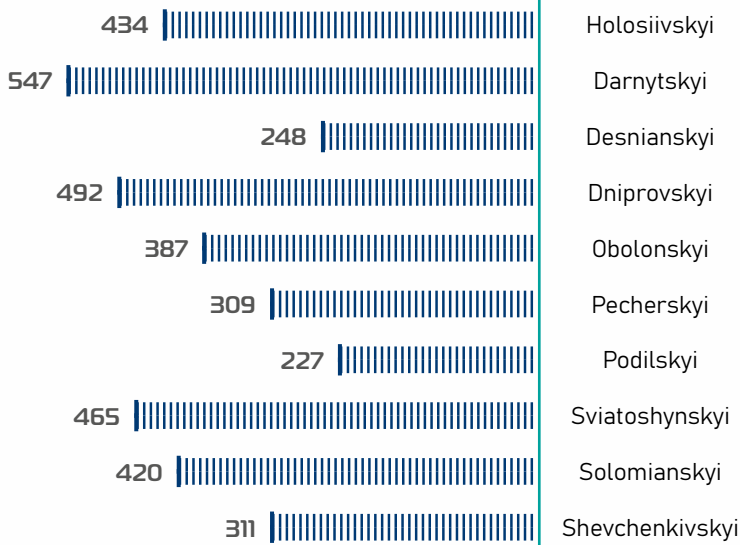

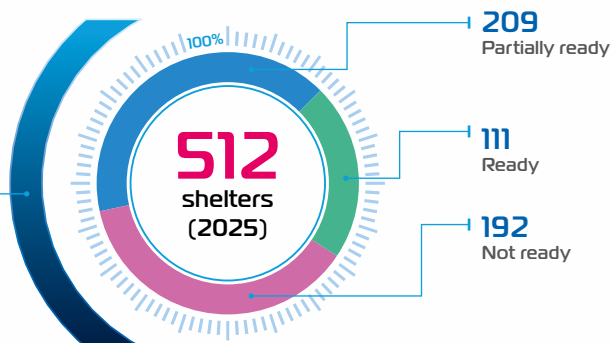
Number of dual-purpose structures and basic shelters (2025)

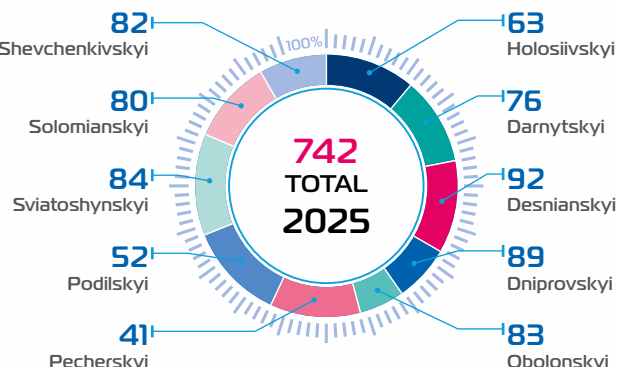

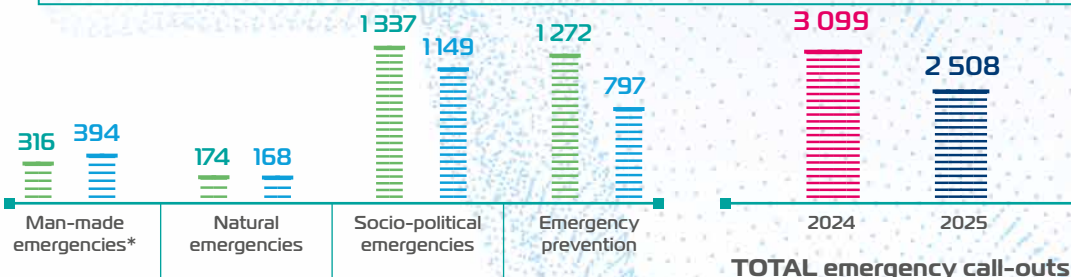

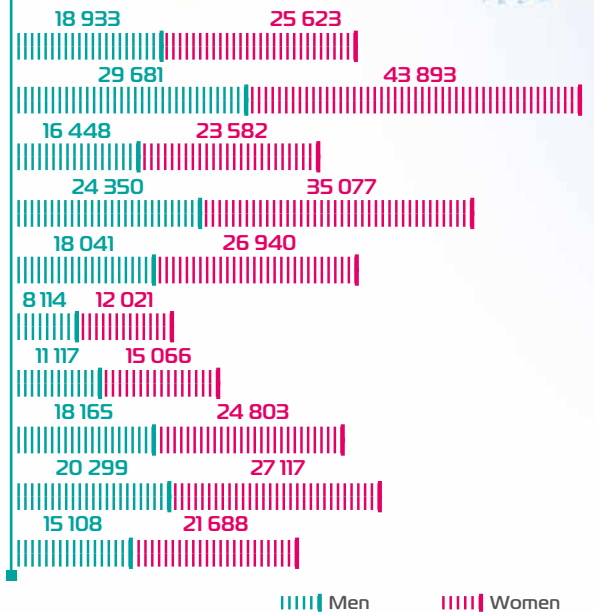

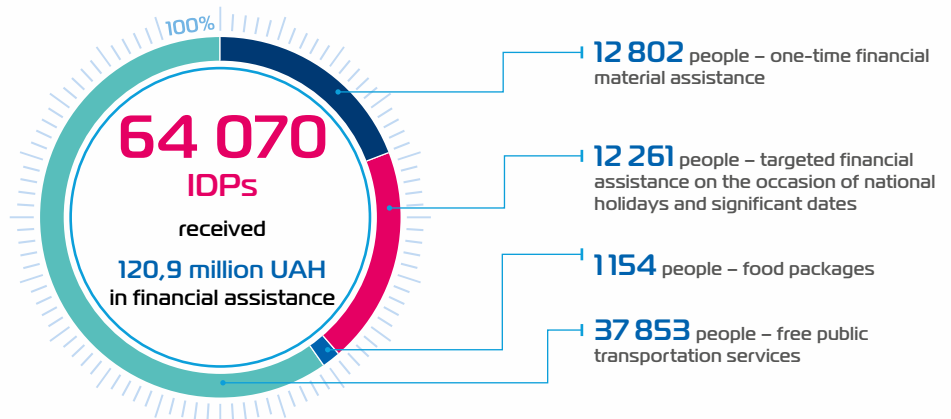

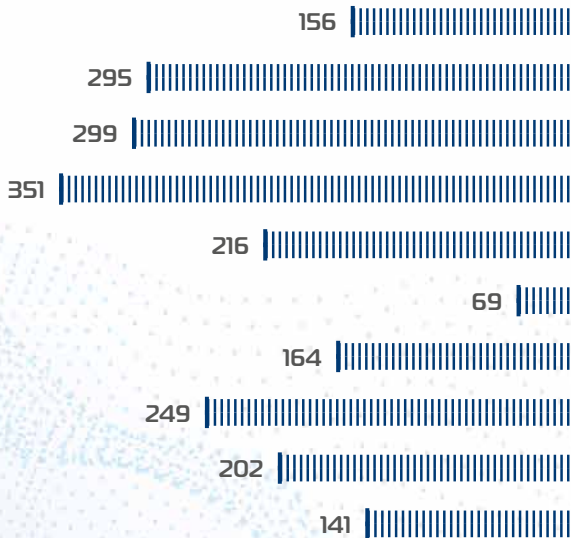

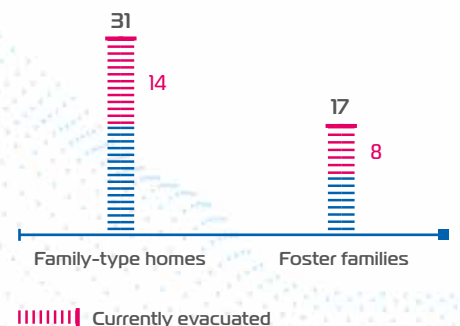

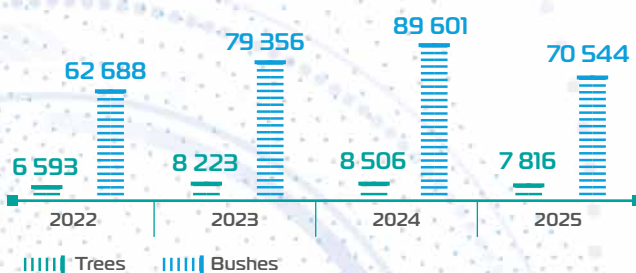

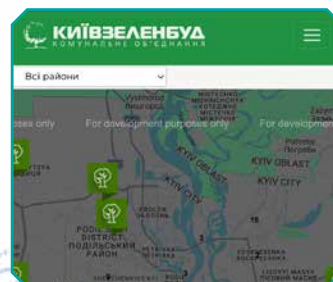

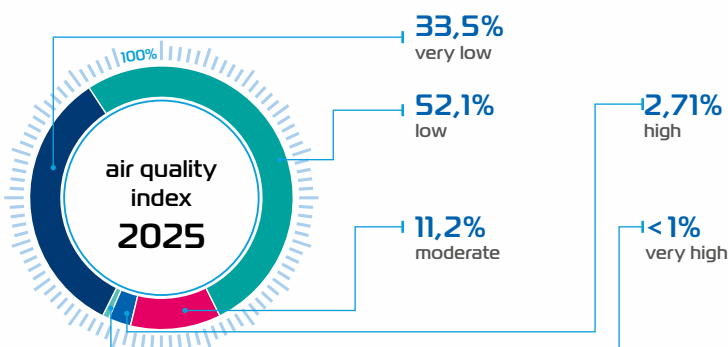

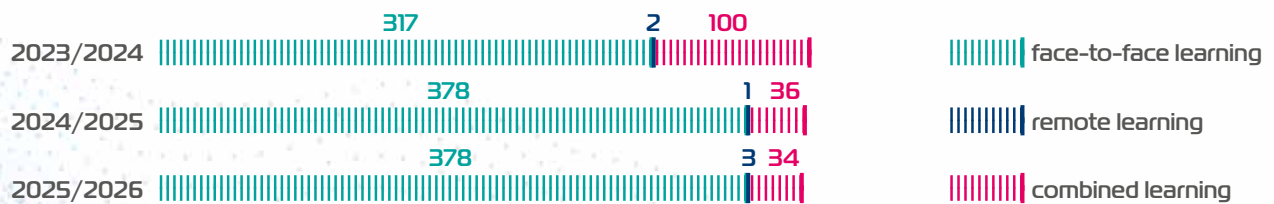
### Network of GSEIs by types and forms of ownership (610 GSEIs)

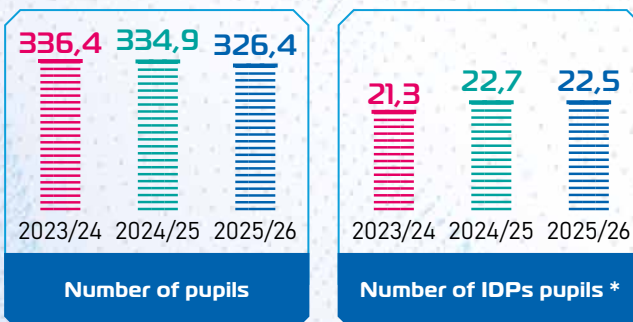

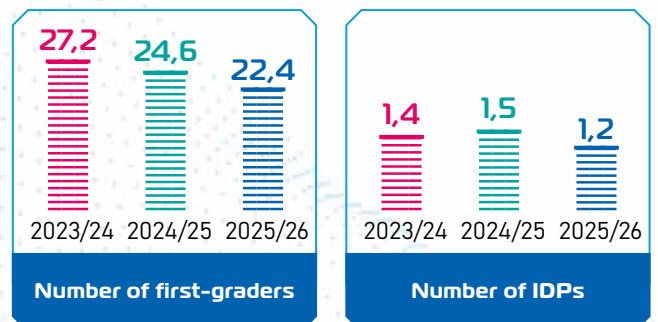

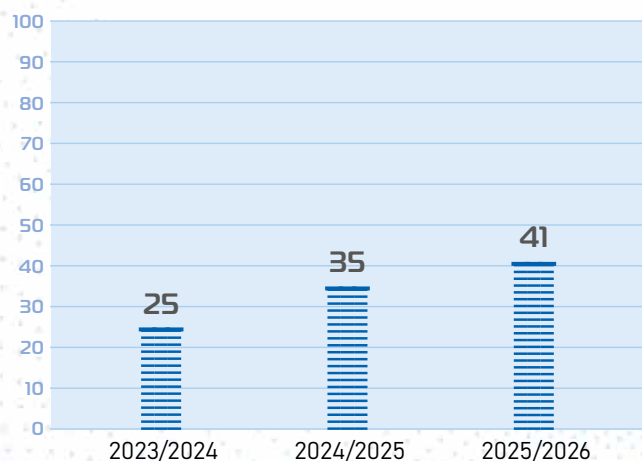

Distribution of OSEIs by teaching format, %

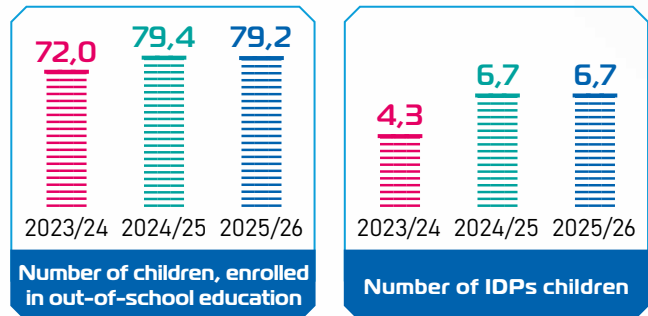

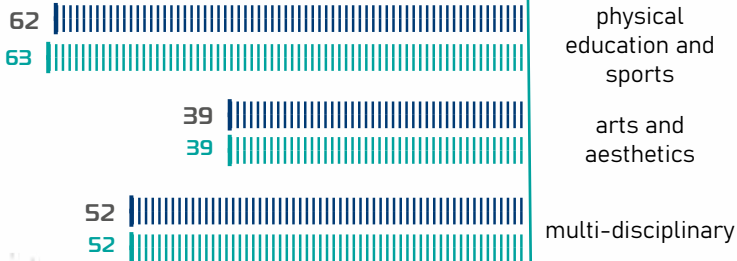

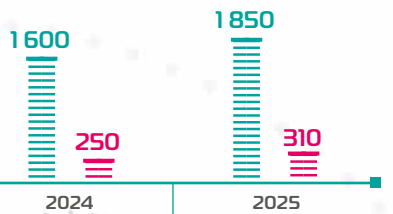

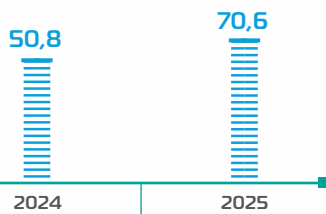

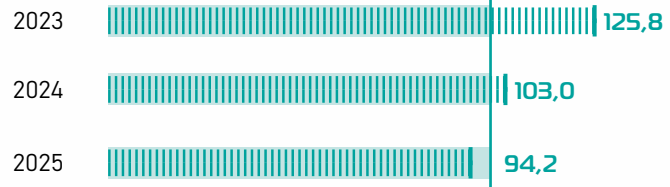

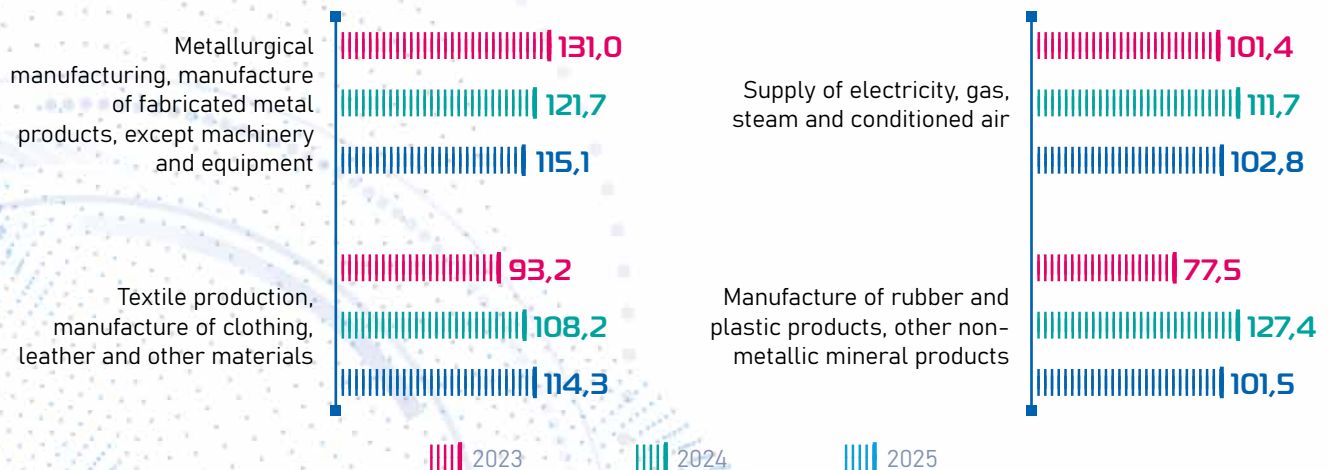

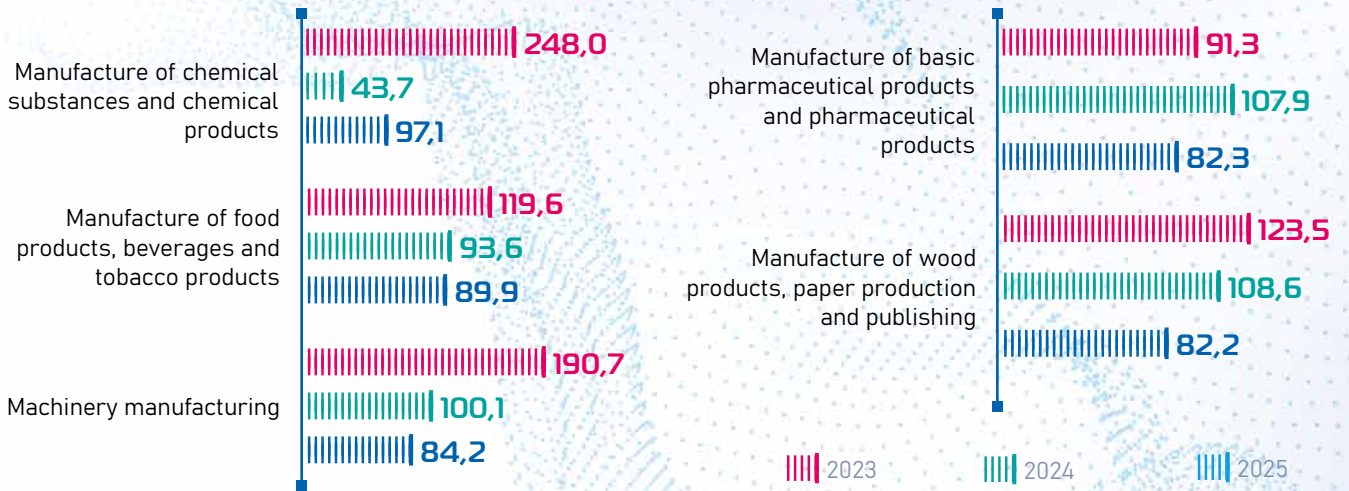


### PRODUCTION GROWTH BY MAIN TYPES OF INDUSTRIAL ACTIVITY, % \*

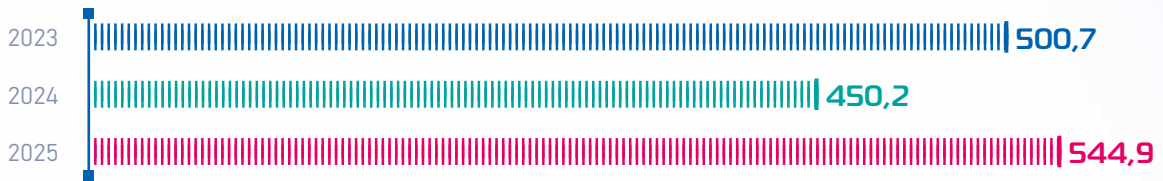

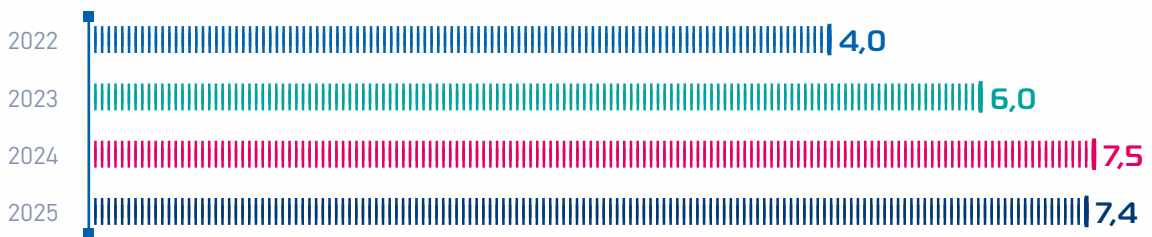

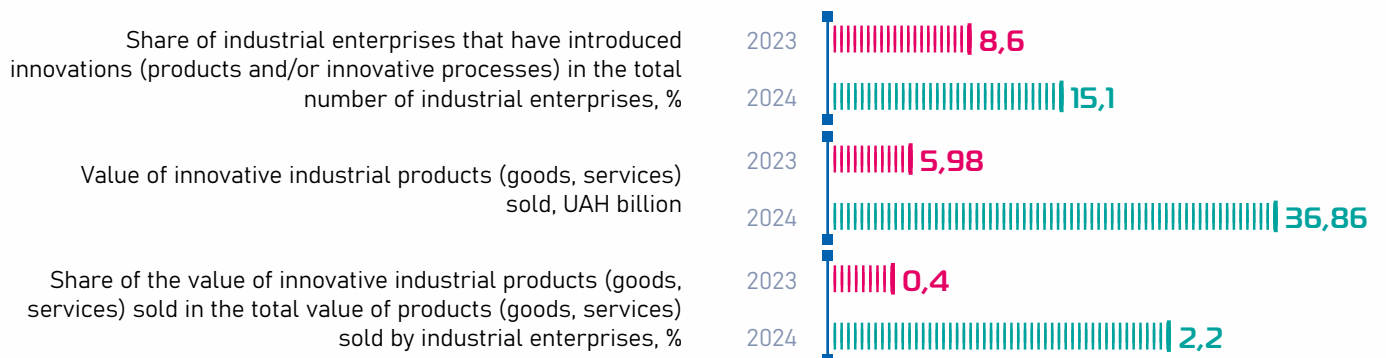

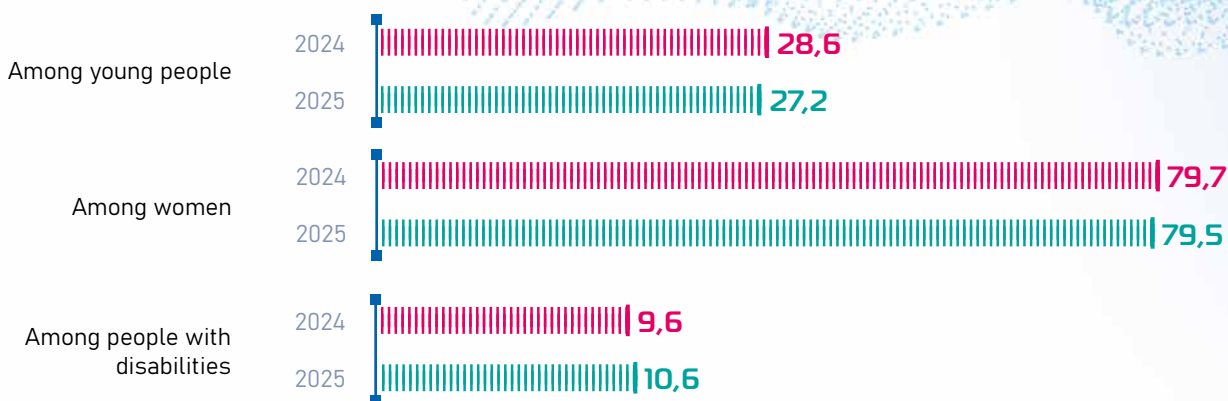

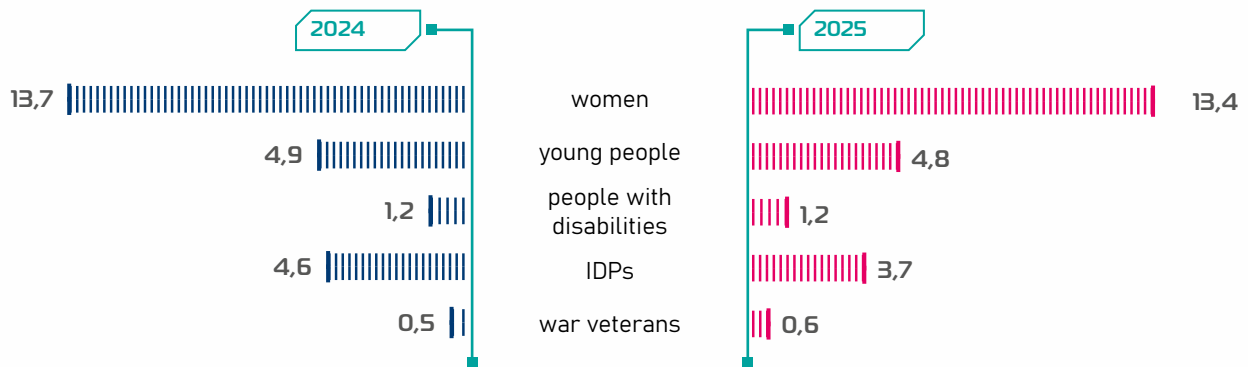

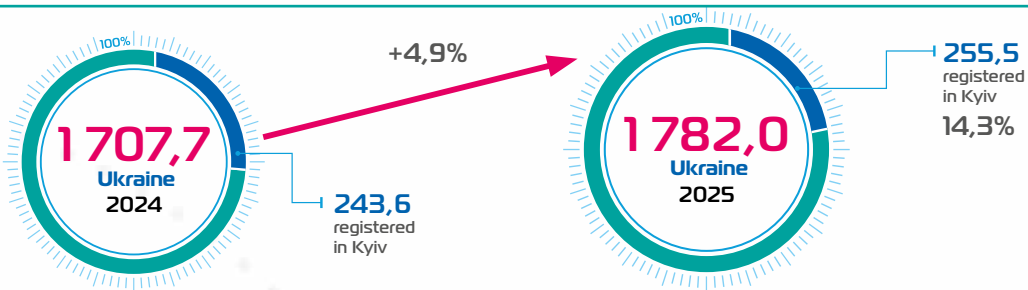

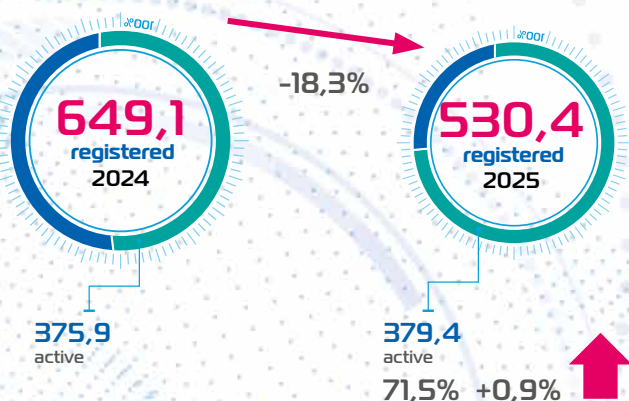

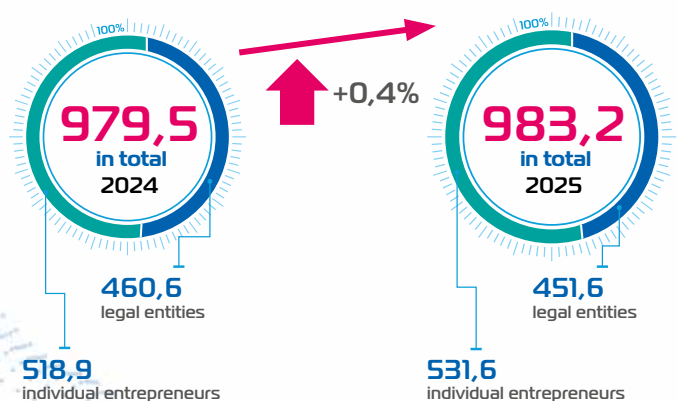

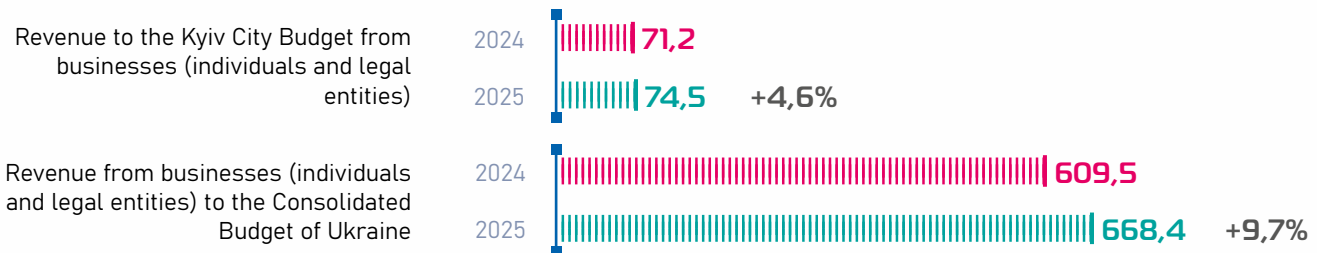

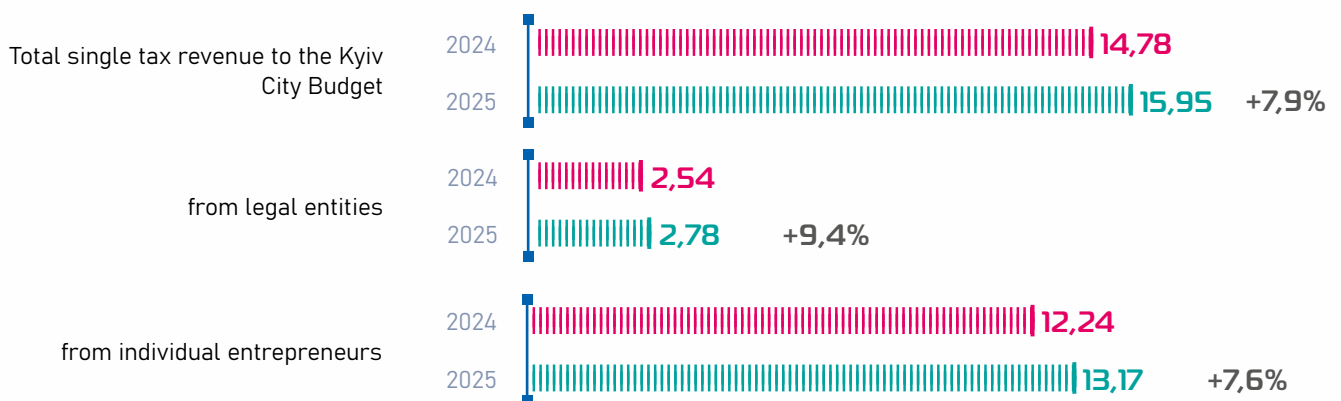

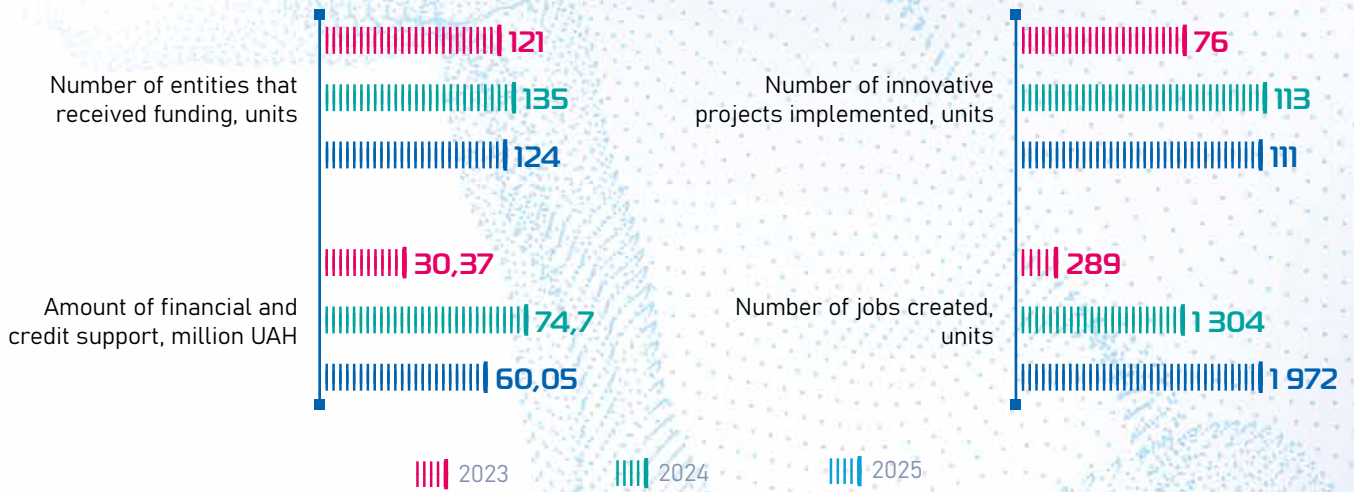

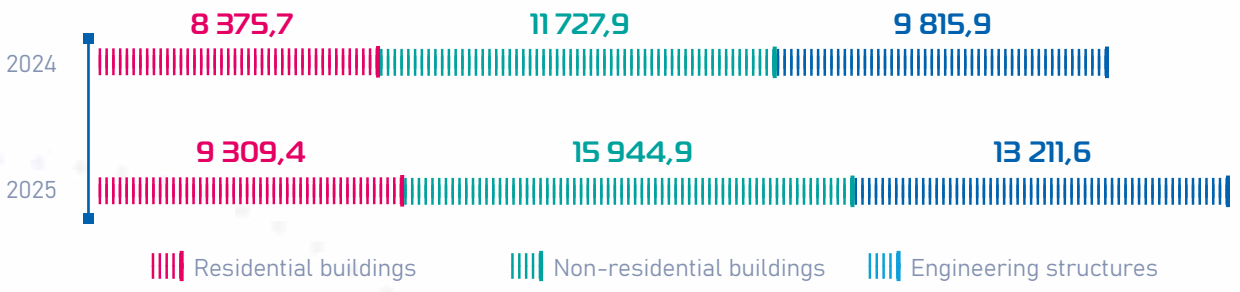

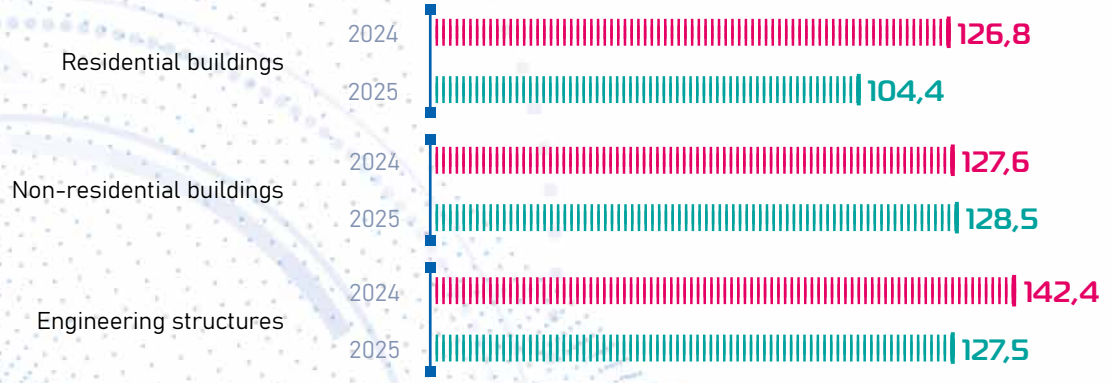

### VOLUME OF CONSTRUCTION PRODUCTS MANUFACTURED BY TYPE\*, MILLION UAH



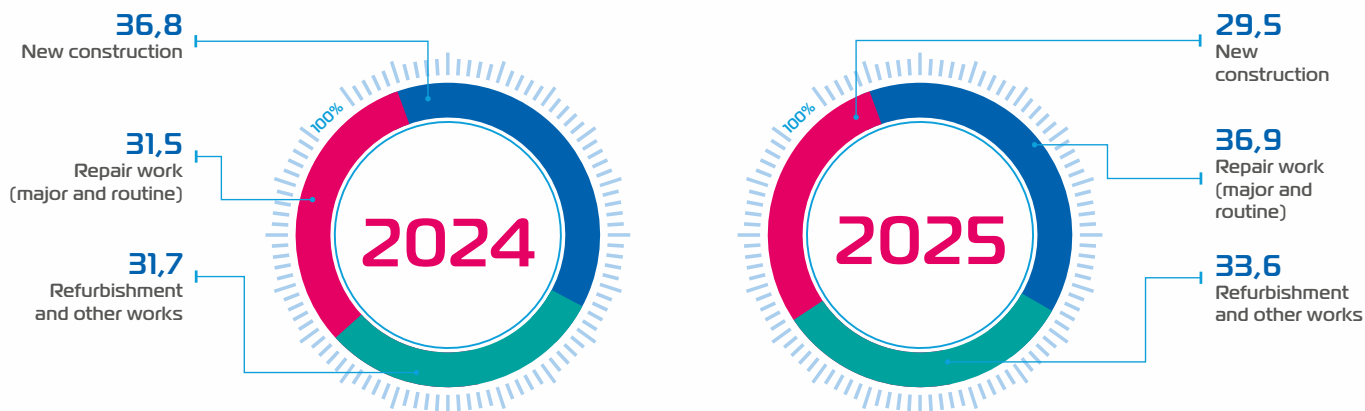

### CONSTRUCTION PRODUCT INDEX BY TYPE\*



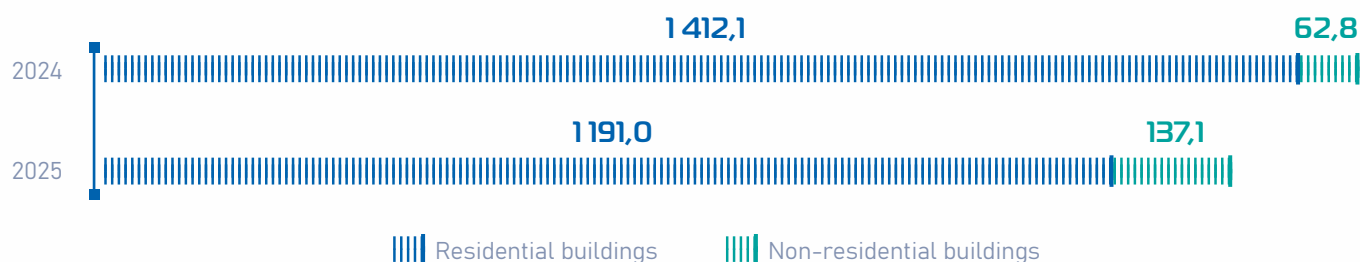

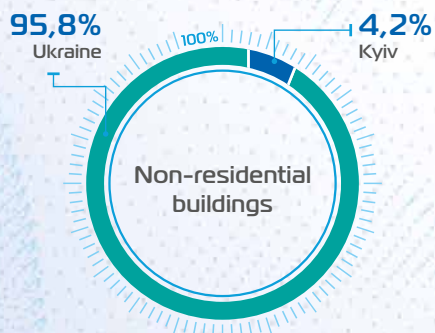
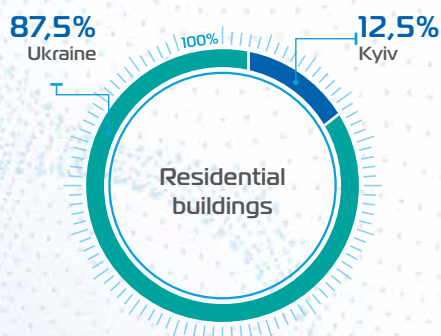

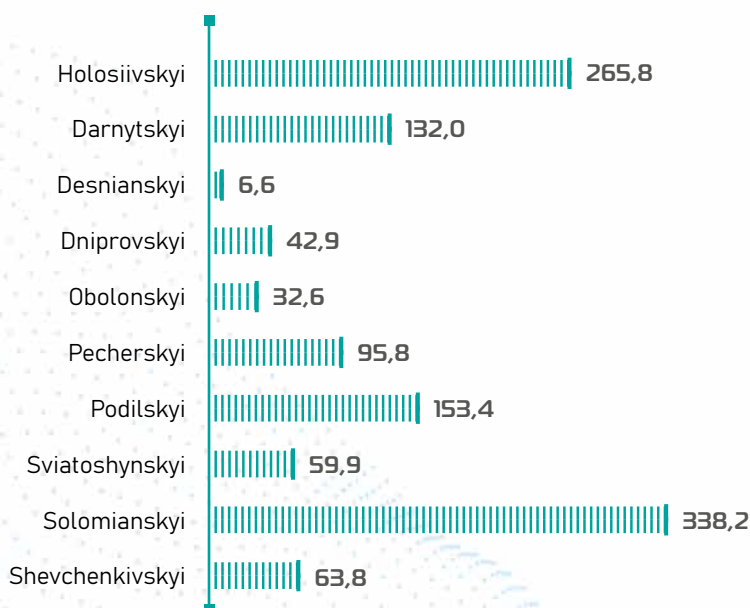

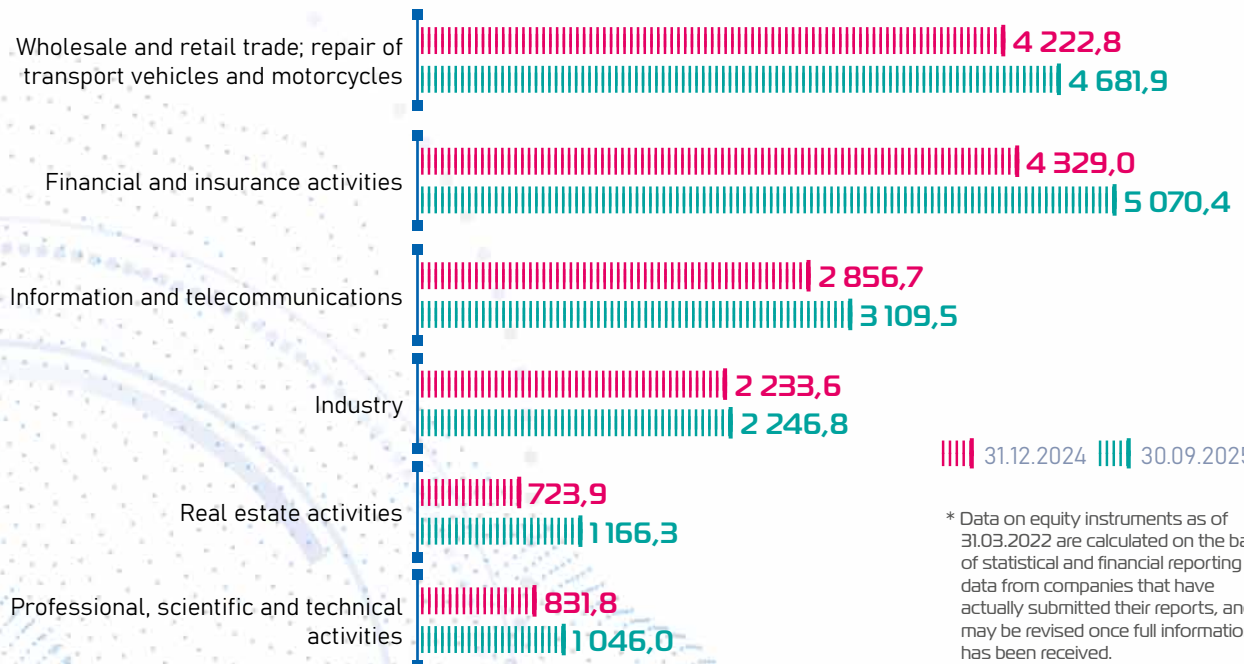

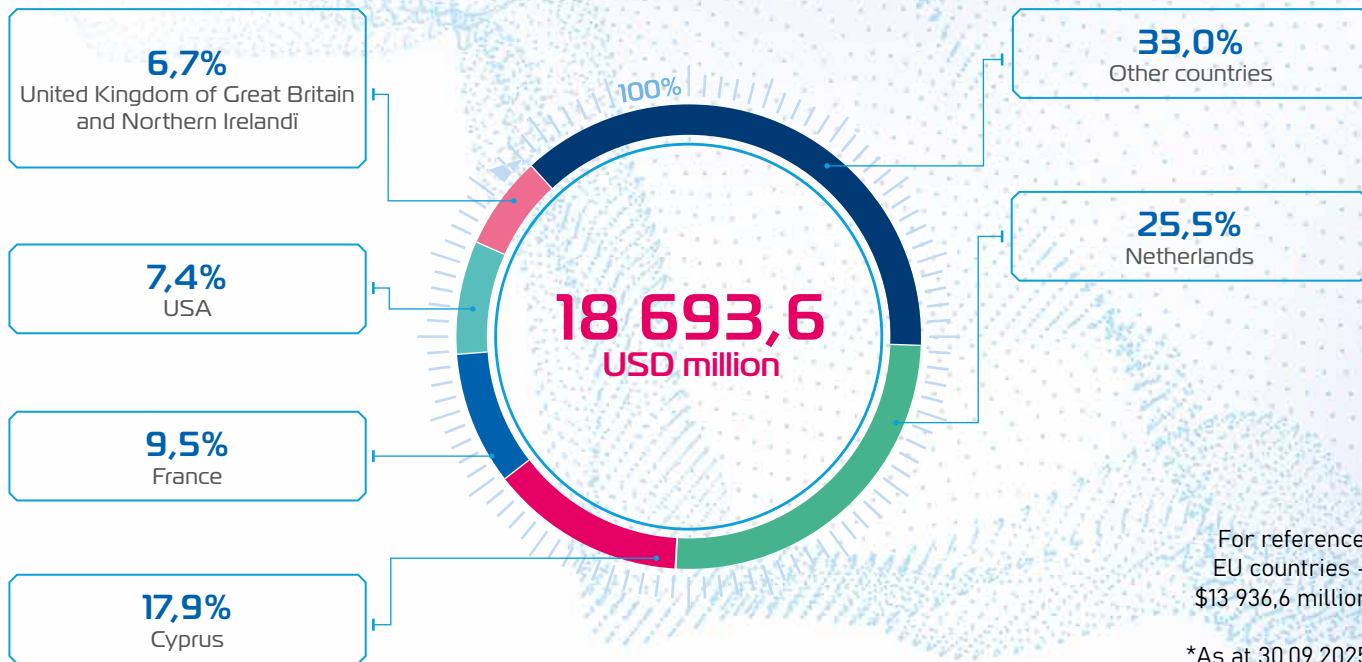

GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION OF DIRECT FOREIGN INVESTMENT, %\*

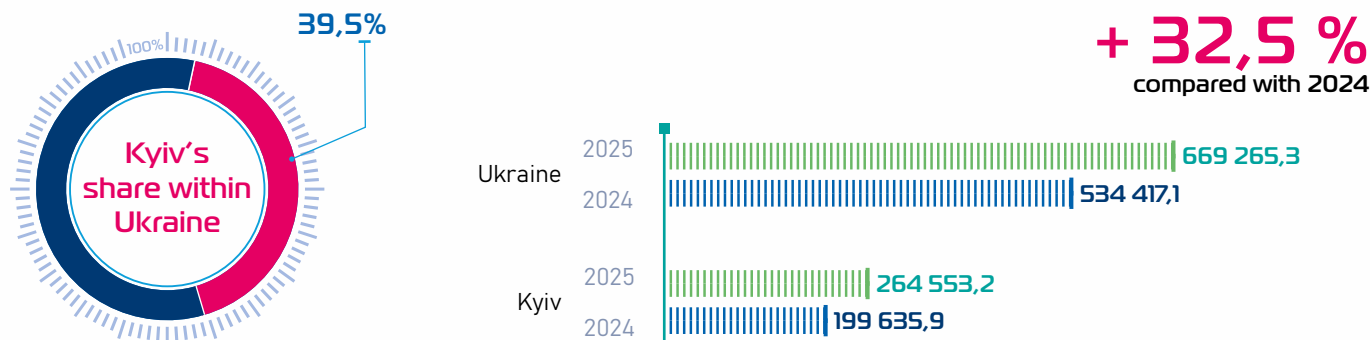

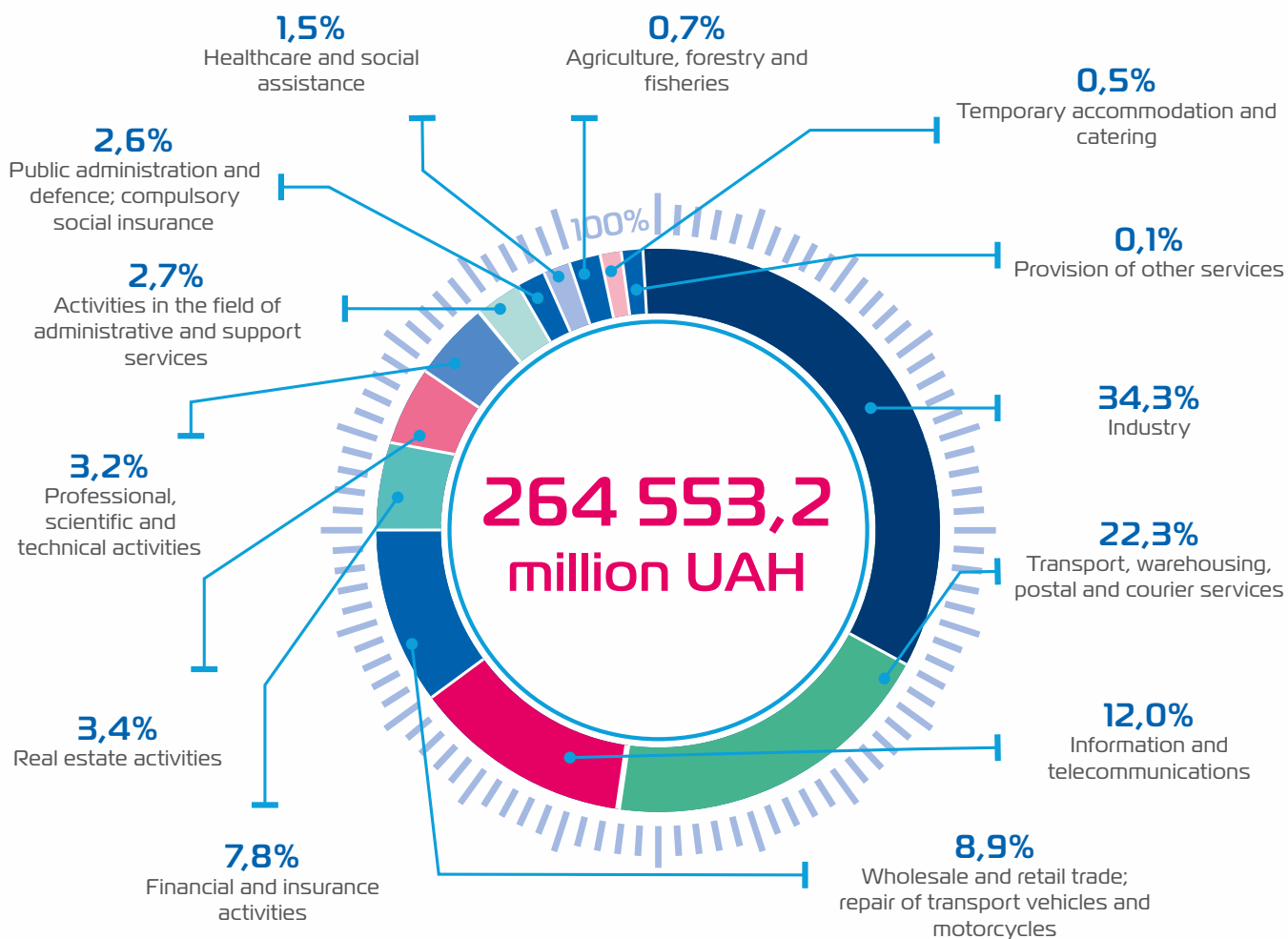

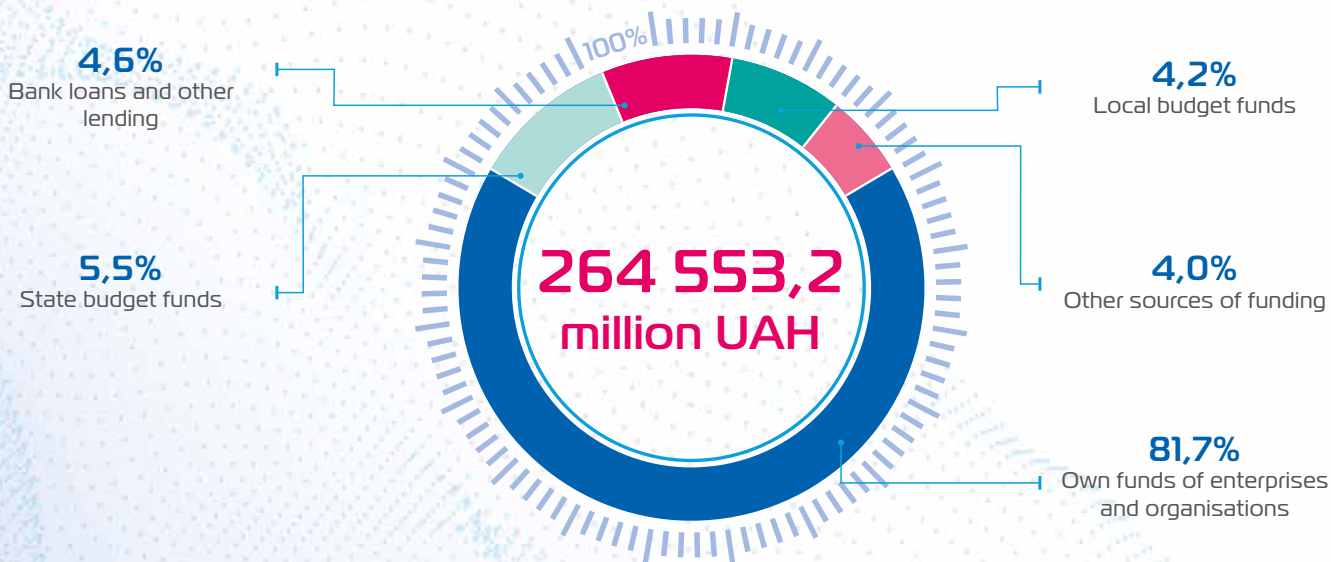

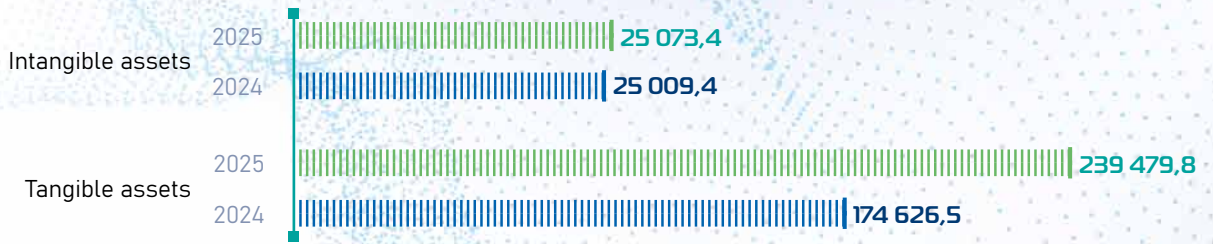

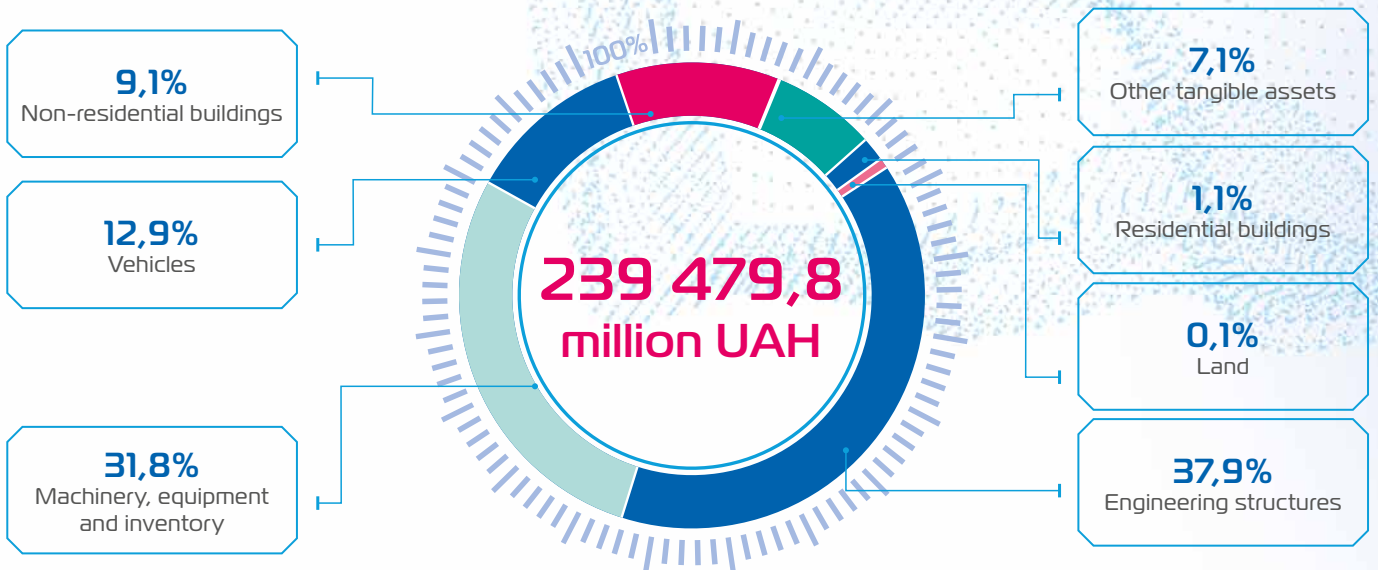

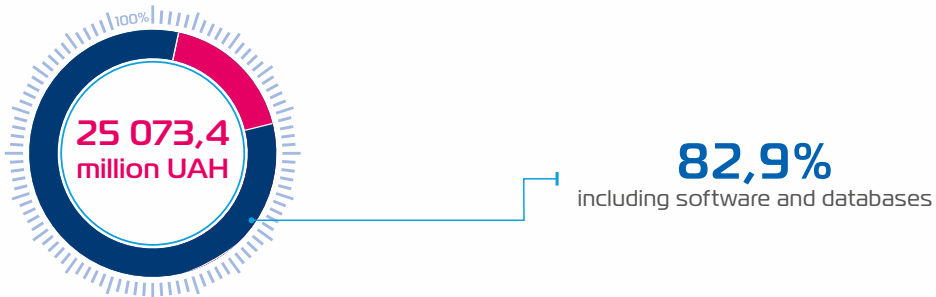

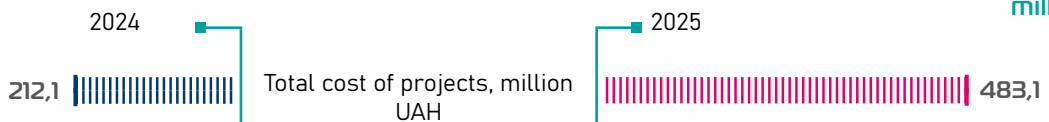

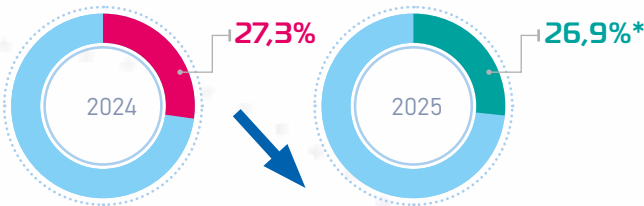

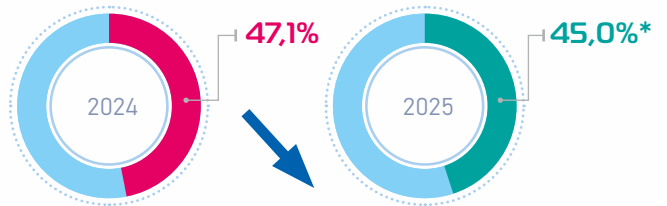

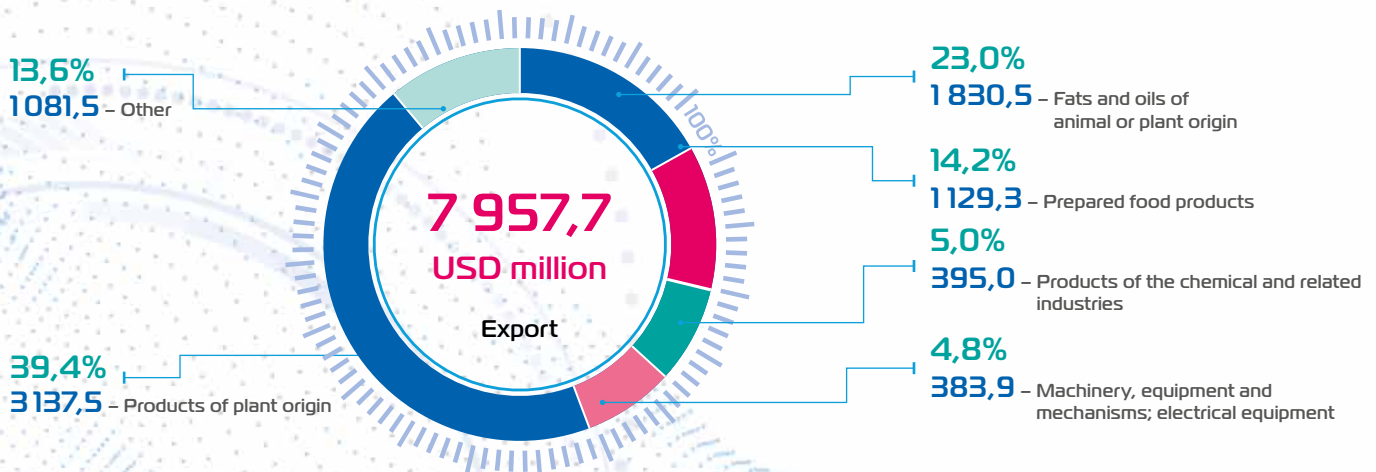
Share of Kyiv in the volume of exports of goods from Ukraine, %

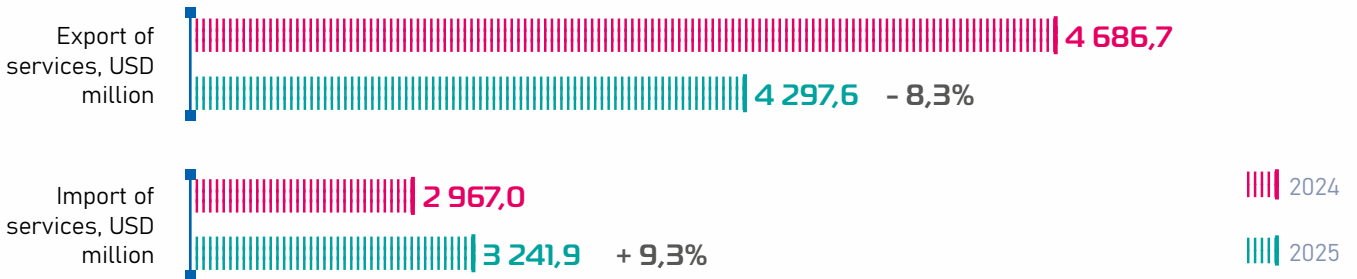

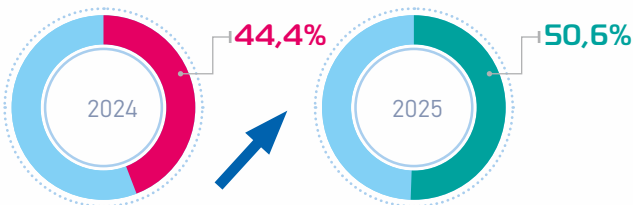

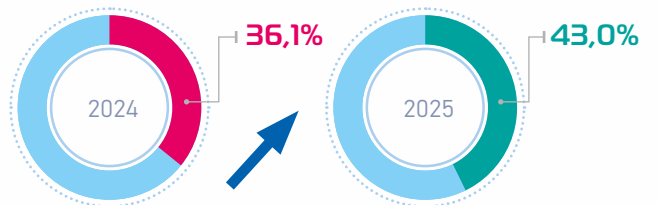

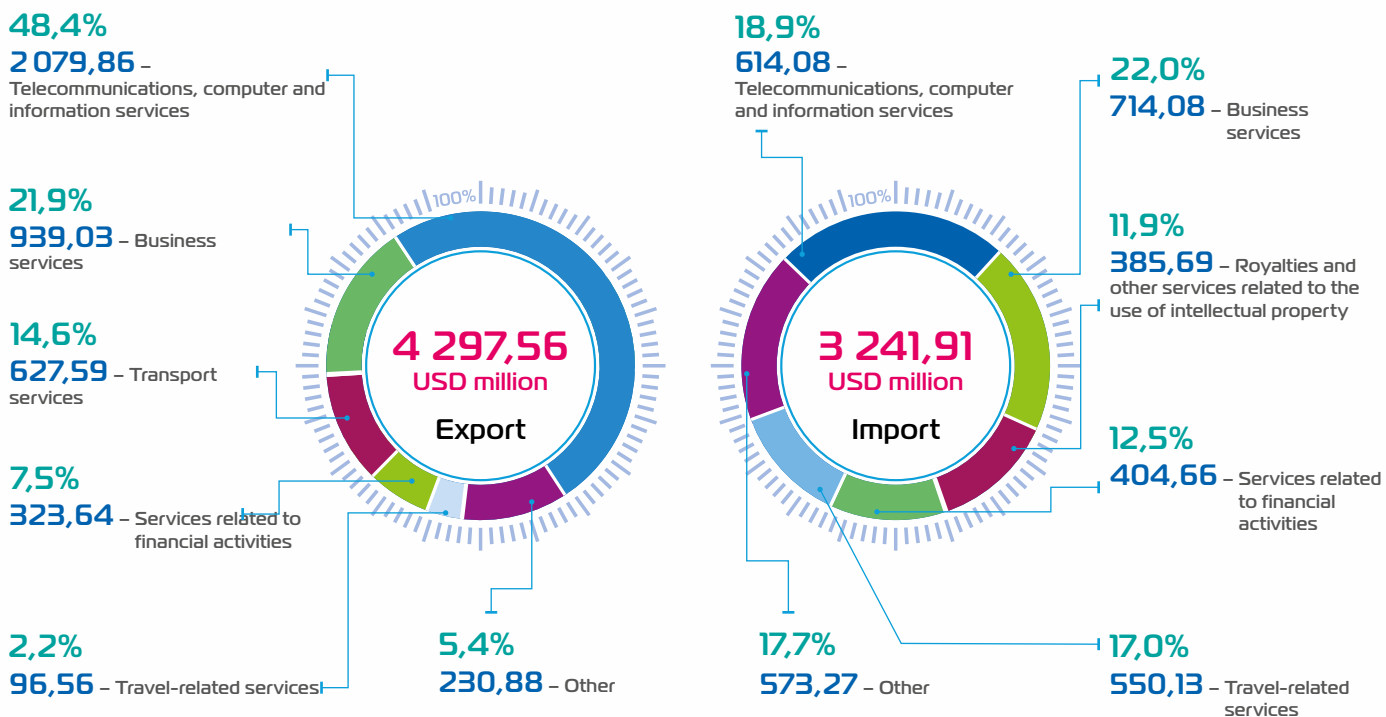
Share of Kyiv in the volume of services exports from Ukraine, %



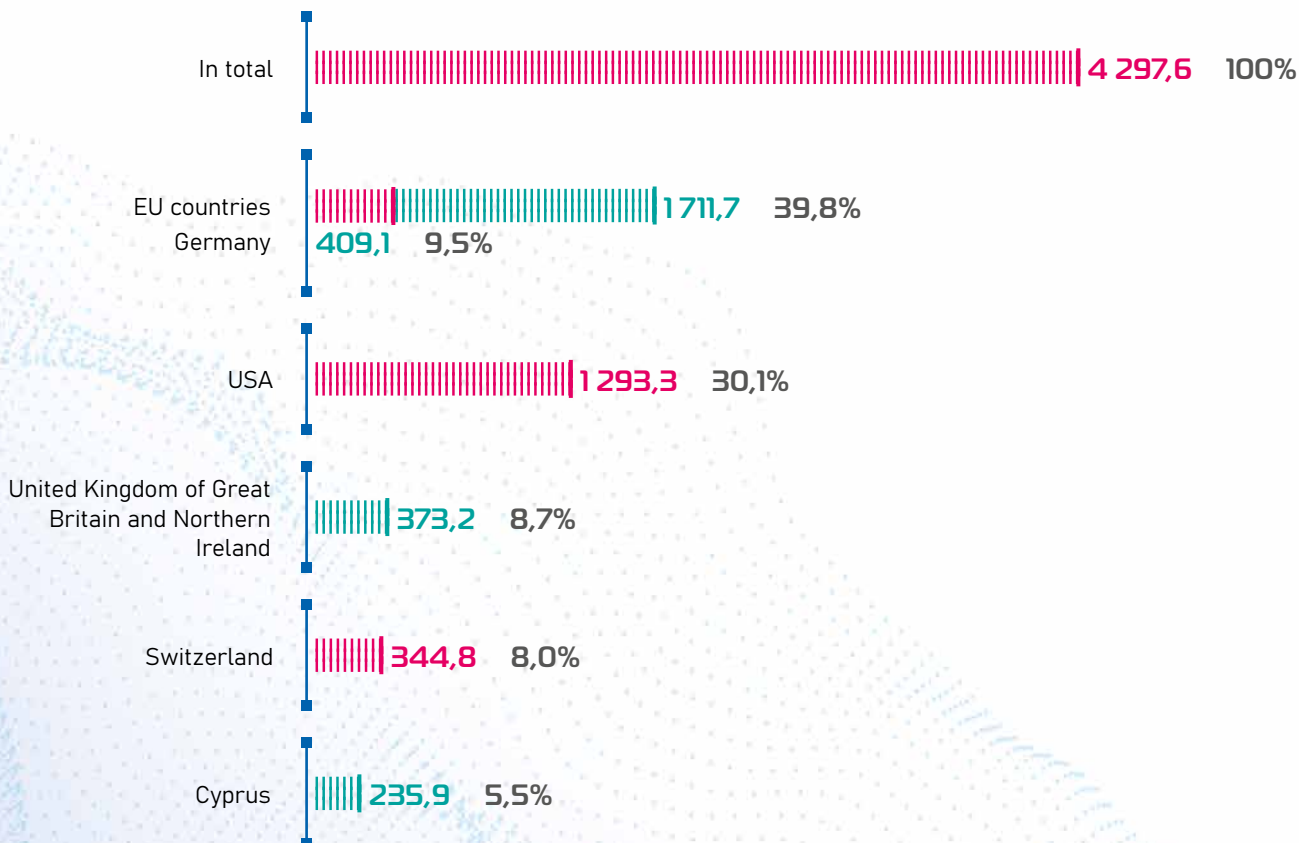
Share of Kyiv in the volume of services imported into Ukraine, %
